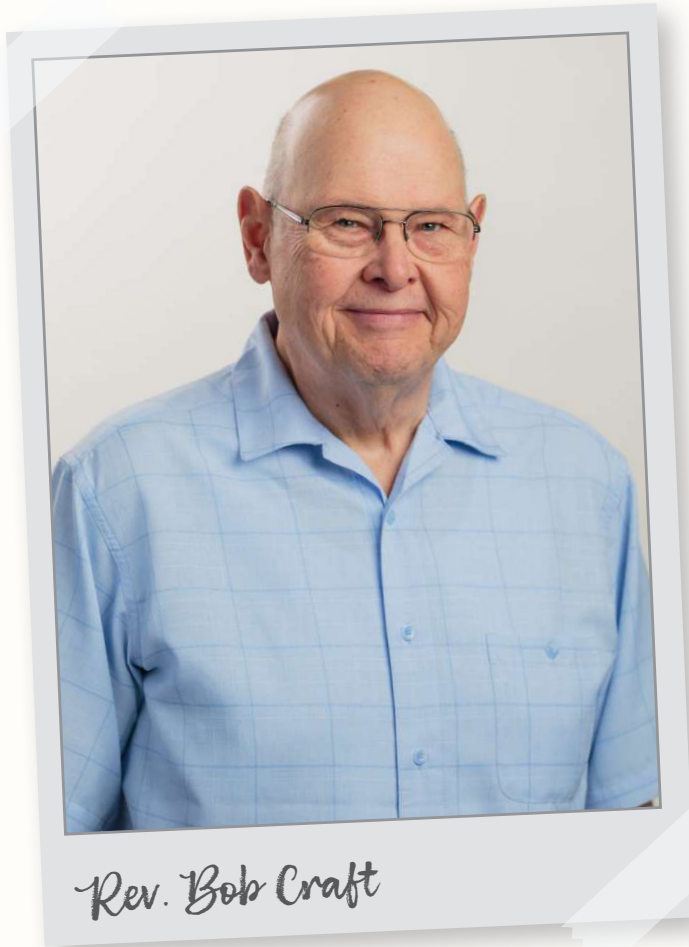

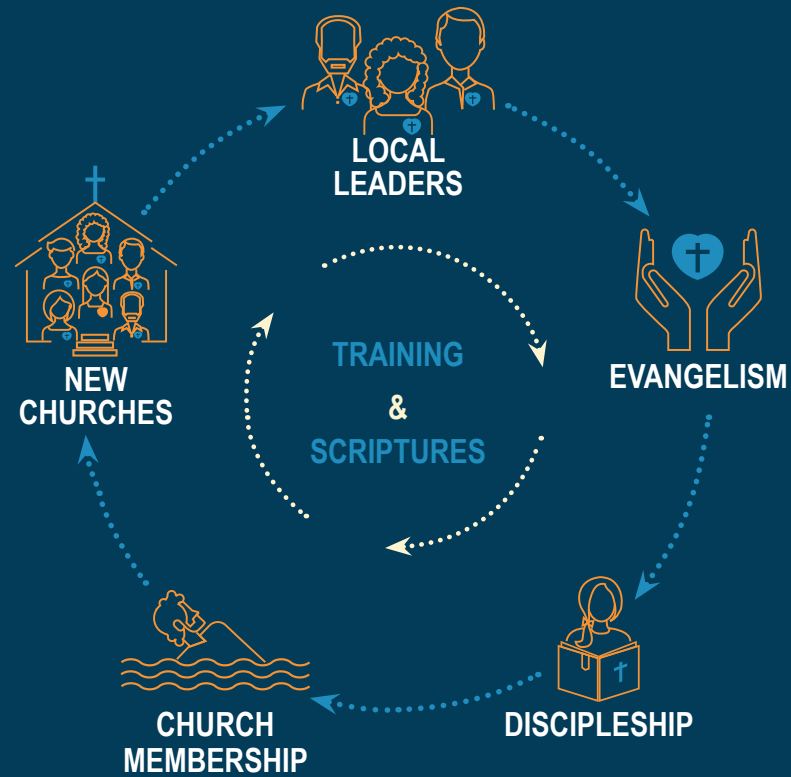

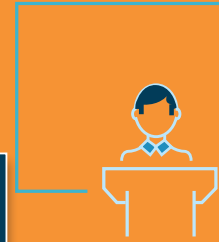
MAPPING AND RESEARCH

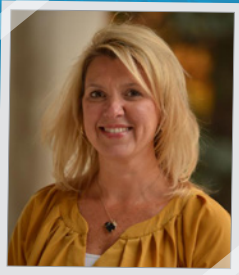

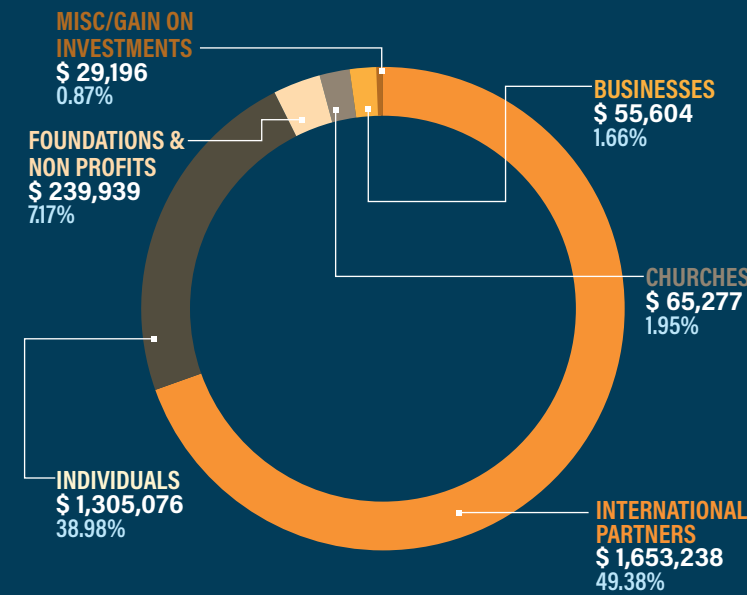

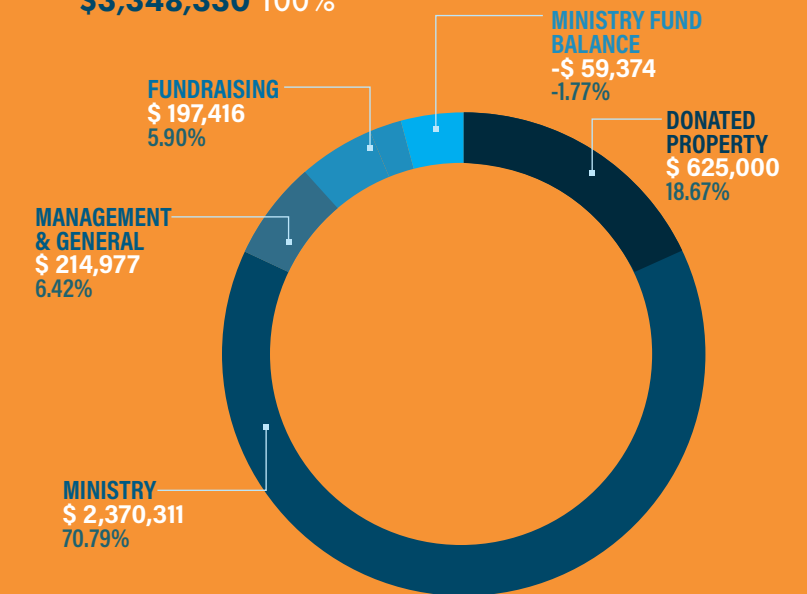
Total Funding Sources

Year in Review

MAY 2024

Two mass baptism events occurred this month in Thailand. In total, 4,022 new believers were baptized!



In Sihanouk province, Cambodia, our Cambodian partners organized a conference about evangelism. Our partners, the Cambodia Christian Church Network Council, and member representatives from 25 cities and provinces organized the



JUNE 2024

opening of the Cambodia Christian Conference under the leadership of His Excellency Nhem Valy, Secretary of the Ministry of Nature and Religion. 170 people attended.

Reach A Village was thrilled to partner with WFRN, based in Elkhart, Indiana, for the first time! We raised enough funds through a three-day radio campaign and match offer to provide over 8,200 Bibles and establish seven new churches! Praise the Lord!



Pastor Joseph and two others serve as a team to teach Values Education in Filipino schools. They went to a beach to baptize ten students from their Values class that they had been mentoring.

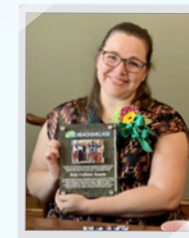

JULY 2024

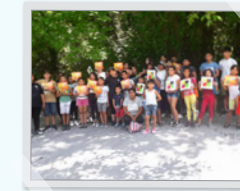
In Armenia, 648 children participated in Christian summer camps!

Research and Mapping

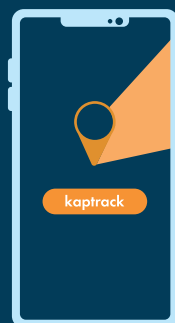
Reach A Village strives to provide digital tools that enhance global ministry operations. For example, our ministry partners in Thailand have been field testing apps since 2016 when The Free in Jesus Christ Church Association (FJCCA) began sending out ministry teams to villages in Central Thailand.

Reach A Village is diligent about capturing the ministry results using a combination of digital platforms and tools. With the help of collaboration and insights from Bob Craft of Reach A Village, Dwight Martin, IT programmers, and local Thai leaders, the KapTrack app has been developed and is now available for use in Thailand. As the next necessary revolution in missions, this app offers Reach A Village's ministry partners three key functions: capture, tracking and insight.

KapTrack provides our global leadership teams with versatile tools to collect ministry metrics while in the field. The local and regional leadership teams can then access these dynamic databases and develop strategic insights based on customized data collection.

By adding KapTrack to the toolbox for our ministry partners and leaders, Reach A Village continues to add value to the outreach of local ministry teams. KapTrack will eventually be adopted and customized for each country based on the recommendations of each national leadership team. Cambodia will soon be the second country to integrate the app with their ministry.

Ministry Updates

UKRAINE – KYIV

In this period, there were many severe attacks on Kyiv; some of the bombs fell very close to our ministry partner's national headquarters and the local evangelical church. Praise God the office building was not damaged, and none of our partners were hurt. But on a few occasions, they could not get to work.

In October 2023, six thousand cards were printed with a prayer of repentance and the Lord's prayer for soldiers. Five thousand have already been distributed to military units through volunteers. These cards help soldiers quickly turn to God in prayer during the most challenging times.

Our partners in Kyiv received three different brochures for work among the military personnel. Most of these materials have already been distributed through chaplains working in hospitals, military units, and places of military operations.

Reach A Village ministry partners in Kyiv have a very good relationship with the Association of Christian Military

Personnel. Together they organized and held a meeting for the relatives of Christians serving in the army. This event was the first meeting of this nature. Previously, meetings were held on an ongoing basis with only widows of military personnel. In the future, they plan to hold regular, similar meetings.

God has uplifted our partners in Ukraine by revealing the fruits of their labor. Church planter Viktor shared how Bible Study materials provided in part by Reach A Village were instrumental in initiating a new Bible study group for non-believers.

And finally, thanks to the funding from Reach A Village, our partners were able to support or provide Bible Study materials and children's Bibles to 22 summer camps, reaching 1666 kids. 3,835 Bible Study books were distributed, and 886 children accepted Christ as Savior.

UKRAINE – CHERKASY

In December 2023, there were seven strong attacks on Cherkasy and the surrounding area, resulting in the destruction of 56 houses and leaving many people dead or injured. Our ministry partner, Vitaly, thanked God that no believers' homes were damaged, nor were they killed. But they do have problems with the supply of electricity and gas.

Reach A Village partners in Cherkasy actively help injured people by supplying them with bread and firewood. They also continue to care for wounded soldiers and share the Gospel with them. They are holding regular meetings for men and ministers.

In February 2024, our partners organized a training session for 28 pastors from 9 regions across Ukraine, some

of whom traveled over 1000 miles to attend. Many of these pastors are ministering in areas near conflict zones. Despite Cherkasy being bombed seven times in the last six months, the compound where Vitaly and his team operate remains undamaged.

Our partners actively visit, mentor, and support church planters within a 150-mile radius. The needs are substantial, but they continue to provide much-needed encouragement. There is a special ministry dedicated to renovating and restoring damaged church buildings. The roads are in poor condition, riddled with large potholes, requiring Vitaly's car to undergo constant repairs. Nonetheless, he persists in his mission.



MYANMAR'S CIVIL WAR

The Fractured State

This nation remains embroiled in a civil war that became worse during the coup in February 2021. Armed tribal alliances have formed, and local youth are now being trained to fight back against the regime. In 2024, mandatory/forced military service began for young men (ages 18 to 35) and young women (ages 18 to 28). Travel is restricted for youth and young adults, and many have gone into hiding or joined the opposition forces. The Burmese military still control the central section of the country, but they are losing territory daily.

Hope in the middle of a crisis

Despite the challenges of the civil war, the ministry is thriving. Ministry partners and ministry leaders are continuing to share the Gospel in unreached areas. Ministry teams continue to train and equip new believers to carry on the mission of telling their nation about Jesus. "The war has opened the hearts of the Burmese people for the Gospel," said Michael, the national leader, recently.

In March 2024, Ellis Craft of Reach A Village was able to visit Myanmar for the first time since the COVID-19 pandemic. "There were very few foreigners, and people looked shocked to see me there," Ellis said. "The roads had barbed wire barricades prepared and ready to close at a moment's notice. Our leadership had asked us to come, and we took every precaution once in the country to ensure everyone's safety. Being together, face to face, was so meaningful. Nothing can replace that."

Ministry partners in Myanmar report that in 2024, more than 300 new house churches were started and hundreds of thousands of ministry resources were provided to reach the lost with the Gospel. Thousands of new believers are being encouraged, discipled and trained by ministry leaders and local believers. Believers continue to care for those who are fleeing the warzones in the midst of the atrocities that are reportedly being committed by the Burmese military. Please keep this nation and its beautiful people in your prayers.



THAILAND

Exciting reports continue to come in from Thailand about the continuing growth of the Church there: new believers, new Bible study groups started, new churches, thousands of baptisms! Reach A Village is partnering with The Association of Free Churches of Thailand (AFT) and the Free in Jesus Christ Church Association (FJCCA) to share the Gospel. Seeds planted in the first three provinces reached are continuing to bear fruit. Great progress is being made toward the goal of reaching every village in Thailand with the Good News about Jesus.

In Khon Kean, the easternmost province currently being reached, there were 1,495 baptisms on May 24, 2024. On May 31, in Phetchabun province, 2,527 people were baptized. On August 30, Ellis Craft of Reach A Village, the director of ministry for Cambodia, and a donor witnessed

2,477 baptisms. To the glory of God, ministry leaders were able to provide 500 Thai Bibles for those baptized, and 1,000 Bibles went to where they were most needed.

"We have baptized more than 10,000 new believers this year," said one of the ministry leaders. "We are excited to announce that we now have the funding we need to enter a new province. Church planting teams will be starting work there soon. This is near the province where Bob Craft, founder and president of Reach A Village, began his missionary journey in 1979."

"The Holy Spirit is reaching the heart of Thailand," he added. "This is the result of many prayers, hard work of the local believers, and sacrificial giving by many."

THE GOSPEL OF ACCEPTANCE Bible Study Ministry — Serbia



From the outside looking in, people and situations are often difficult to understand. Think about the women who looked into the empty tomb. Or the four friends who lowered their paralyzed friend into the room where Jesus was teaching. Or Peter as he watched the arrest and persecution of Jesus. Or the Israelites as they watched Moses enter the Tent of Meeting to talk with God. No matter where we stand with the Lord, sometimes our faith can be difficult to understand.

During a meeting of believers in Serbia, Samir noticed a man standing just outside the entrance to the room. As the worship songs continued, the man stayed. During the preaching of God's Word, the man stayed. Samir could tell that the man was listening carefully to what was happening. During the prayers, the man stayed. After the closing blessing, Samir could hardly wait to go outside and talk with the man.

"His name is Isko," Samir says. "He didn't want to come into our group that day, but he invited me to come to his home the following day. I gladly accepted his invitation."

When Samir arrived at Isko's home, Isko excitedly welcomed him. For the next several hours, Isko asked Samir many questions. He wanted to know more about God. Samir had answers for him from the truth of God's Word.

"As I shared more with him, I asked Isko if he wanted to pray with me," Samir says. "Isko already knew that he needed God in his life. We prayed his first prayer together. That day, he accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. Praise be to our Lord who touches and changes hearts in so many different ways!"

ROOTED IN THE GOSPEL Church Planting— Albania



Kozma* is a follower of Jesus who shares the Gospel in Albania. About 1,000 people live in his village. During the day, he works at a job. But later in the day, he meets with people and tells them about our God who loves them.

"I began by sharing the Gospel with my family members," Kozma says. "At first, their reaction was negative. They didn't support me. They began criticizing me for everything I was saying and doing. I felt like they didn't love me." Many believers we read about in the Bible — including Jesus — experienced this kind of rejection.

More than 56 percent of the population in Albania is Muslim, 7 percent are Orthodox, and 10 percent are Roman Catholic. In 1967, all mosques and churches were closed, and religious observances were prohibited. In 1990, Albania began allowing private religious practice again, but many people have only a traditional faith instead of a personal faith.

Even in this challenging context, Kozma never gives up. "I prayed for my family, that God would work in their hearts and lives," he says. "My family members are now my biggest supporters. My mother accepted Christ and started sharing the Gospel with other women in our village. My brother did the same with his friends."

Today, Kozma and his family are ministering to 25 families and 100 children. God's Word is bringing hope and joy into their lives. "I am thankful for the training and Bible study resources I'm receiving," he says. "My vision for the future is to preach the Gospel throughout our district. I want to reach more lost people with the Good News."

Prayer request: One of the biggest challenges Kozma faces is the lack of a building where believers can meet together. Please pray that he will find the meeting space they need.

NOTHING CAN STOP THE GOSPEL Persecuted Christians — China



Technology is a tool God uses to spread the Gospel. But the enemy is also finding ways to use that tool in his efforts to derail the Gospel. Right now in China, followers of Jesus are enduring government persecution because of the misuse of technology.

China's citizens are now forced by their government to use a smartphone app called WeChat to pay for all products and services. WeChat — completely controlled by Chinese government agencies — stores all their personal information, including their home address, bank accounts, correspondence, and phone calls. The government can easily track a person's movements around the country, payment for services and goods, income and expenses. Now, a ministry leader who travels to another area and holds a church meeting can be tracked by the government.

With China's population of more than 1.4 billion people, such specific tracking seems almost impossible. But recently, one ministry leader traveled from his home in one province to another one in order to train a group of 70. They gathered at a hotel where they had met before. This time, when he used WeChat to pay for the hotel expenses, the police received information about his arrival from another province and his current location.

During the training session, the police entered the room and arrested 7 of the people present for unlawful assembly. Those arrested were given different punishments: 2 were given 15 days of house arrest; 2 were given 5 days of house arrest; and 3 were given 7 days in jail.

Believers in China refuse to live in fear. With your help, our ministry partners and ministry leaders are continuing to train and encourage local believers as they share the Gospel.

Prayer request: Please pray for wisdom and safety for the ministry leaders and local believers in China as they continue to grow the Church there, even under difficult conditions.



BLESSINGS IN THE SECOND CHANCES Second Chance Blessings — Philippines



Dalisay* grew up in a broken and difficult family in the Philippines. "There was so much pressure on me, especially when my parents separated and made me choose the parent I would live with," she says. "I love them both, but I stayed with my mom."

To numb her pain, Dalisay began following the wrong group of students at school. She became rebellious, often drinking and smoking. "My mom used to beat me," she says. "I blamed God and asked Him so many times why He had given me such a difficult family situation."

One of Dalisay's frequent questions was: "Would my family be happier without such a troublesome child? What if I just died?" She often thought about taking her own life. Finally, she attempted to end her life several times by cutting, hanging herself, and even drinking too much.

A week after that drunken incident, Values Education began at Dalisay's school. "Initially, when the leaders were teaching us, I was bored," Dalisay says. "But soon I felt encouraged and wanted to hear what they were saying. They invited us to a youth event, and I went there."

Right away at the event, Dalisay was more encouraged and felt comfortable. Other young people immediately began welcoming her. "I made new friends who brought me closer to the Lord," she says. "That's why I wanted to go back and keep attending. That's where I met the Lord and discovered the purpose of my life. I realized there was still hope for me. That's also when I began avoiding alcohol and the wrong crowd."

"I am thankful to all the volunteers who tirelessly share the Word of God with us," Dalisay adds. "I thank the Lord for giving me a second chance to change."

The World's GREATEST RESCUE MISSION

A new Bible curriculum especially for kids, “The World’s Greatest Rescue Mission” launched in 2023. The curriculum is designed for use in various children’s ministry settings, such as VBS, Sunday school, Christian missions, homeschool missions, social studies lessons, chapel and family devotions.

“Ever since founding Reach A Village, our team and ministry partners have helped place Bible studies with Scripture verses into the hands of countless children around the world,” says Bob Craft, founder and president. “Now, we have released our first curriculum for children right here in the USA!”

“The World’s Greatest Rescue Mission” has five major lessons — featuring the Philippines, Armenia, Ukraine, Cambodia and Bulgaria — designed for children in the U.S. The goal is to help them understand the Gospel and the Great Commission, learn about other nations, and grow in Christian character with five biblical values. The teaching guide provides a plan for the curriculum to be taught once weekly over an entire school year.

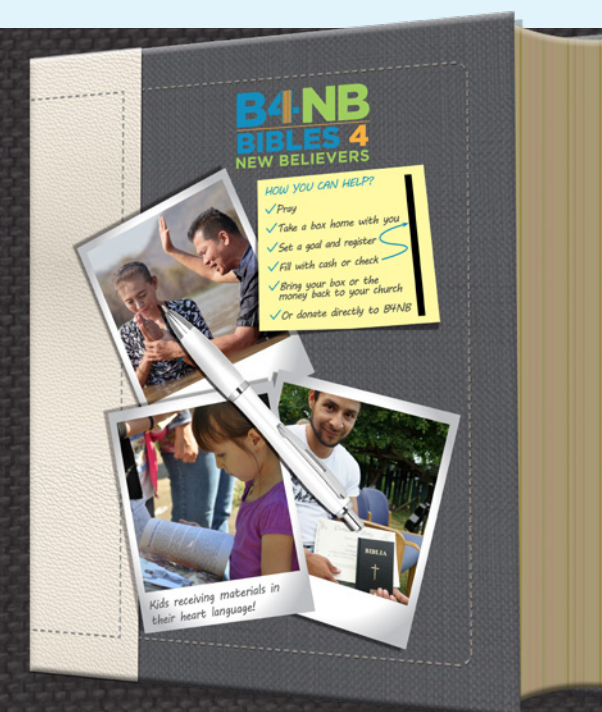
